The global initiative "aims to raise awareness about discrimination, violence and challenges faced by the LGBTQIA+ community," <u>according to May17.org</u>. In explaining more about the 2024 theme and the history of IDAHOBIT, the website continues:

"The world has just celebrated the 75th anniversary of the <u>Universal Declaration of Human Rights</u> — a document that is much more than a cornerstone of international law: it is a guide to navigate a deeply divided world, a set of values that everyone can live by, and ultimately a force for good. And yet, we know that 'All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights' represents a promise not yet fulfilled—for LGBTIQ people across the world, and for everyone experiencing the suffocating impact on their lives of diverse layers of inequalities. This year's IDAHOBIT theme is a call for unity: only through solidarity for each other will we create a world without injustice, where no one is left behind....

"The date of 17 May was specifically chosen to commemorate the World Health Organization's decision in 1990 to declassify homosexuality as a mental disorder.

"The day represents a major global annual landmark to draw the attention of decision makers, the media, the public, corporations, opinion leaders, local authorities, etc. to the alarming situation faced by people with diverse sexual orientations, gender identities or expressions, and sex characteristics."
